Reading at Stocksbridge Junior School

High-quality books

Reading is a key life skill. It is placed at the heart of our curriculum; we have carefully selected texts which will ignite children's imagination, inspire their curiosity and provide a window to the world.

- We will ensure that your child has a reading book which is suitably pitched to build both confidence as a reader and fluency. Some pupils may bring home an additional 'phonics/fluency' book to read aloud to an adult at home throughout the week.
- In school, your child will take a Star Reading Test, which provides them with a Reading Range. The Reading Range is used to help pupils select texts with a suitable level of challenge. Reading Ranges are recorded in the back of the pupil diary and they are updated each time they complete a Star Reading Test. Most school reading books are labelled with the book level, enabling children to choose books which fall within their reading range.
- The website **arbookfind.co.uk** can be used to look up the 'book level' of most popular books. This is particularly helpful when children are choosing books from home, books without a label or books from the library. All books that are labelled or are listed on this website will have a quiz on Accelerated Reader which children are encouraged to take after reading their book.
- Children will also be given login details for myon.co.uk which children can use to access a range
 of e-books at home and at school. All books on myON are quizzable on Accelerated Reader.

School Routines

In school, children have daily opportunities to:

- Read a book of their choice for pleasure;
- Listen to their class book being read aloud by their teacher:
- Be taught comprehension skills in their reading lesson:
- Stamp their home-reads in their Pupil Diary.
 When pupils achieve 30 reads, they earn a
 postcard and a stamp in their Reading Passport.
 Children can earn up to 6 postcards (1 per half-term) each year.
- Use Accelerated Reader to quiz on their book once they have finished reading it - Accelerated Reader can also be accessed at home.

Supporting your child

- Read at least 3 times a week with your child and record this in their pupil diary. Just 10 minutes a day can make a huge difference.
- Make reading time pleasurable by finding a quiet, comfortable space and giving your child your full attention.
- · Ask your child simple questions as they read to check their understanding.
- Use positive language and praise their reading efforts.
- Find opportunities to read to your child. This builds vocabulary, feeds imagination and can even improve sleep patterns when done before bedtime.
- Ask them about books that they are reading at school.
- You may choose to sign up to Renaissance Home Connect. This allows you
 to view the results of Accelerated Reading quizzes that you child has taken.




