It is a pleasure to see our children living out these values in all aspects of their school lives, and we are incredibly proud of each and every one of them.

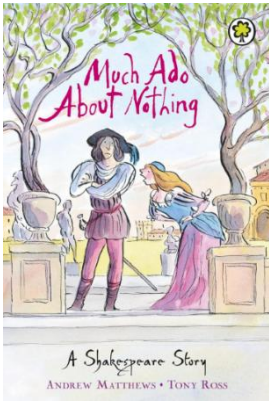
